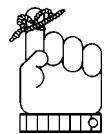

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

September 6, 2017

Following an invocation by **Ken Wells**, the Four-Way Test led by **Mac Walcott**, and other preliminaries, **Becky Jones** introduced her former student, now the director of the Fairhope Museum of History, **Donnie Barrett**, to talk about the museum and especially his recently published book about "Stewart the Picture Man." Becky mentioned that Donnie and his wife are also owners of the second-largest tea plantation in the United States, 5½ acres with 65,000 plants. It's actually small compared to the only other plantation, in Charleston, but Donnie said their size allows them to better manage production; the Charleston farm's green tea, he said, tasted like silage! The museum is doing well, with 24,000 visitors a year. An active Friends organization is helpful in organizing monthly events such as the Elderberry Festival, now in its ninth year. Some exhibits change; currently Fairhope founders are featured. Last year a production company from San Diego filmed the "Roundup play" the museum had been putting on in the Colony cemetery, and a video is now available for sale. The museum also sells his tea, \$9,800 worth last year. When he retires, he will devote himself to tea full-time, hosting 2-3 tour buses a day. When the museum was started in 1995, among its holdings was a collection of photos created by Frank Stewart and the staff at the Fairhope Photo Shop. Donnie began to research them and after four years was ready to create the book, which contains 240 photos from the museum collection, as well as information on Henry George and Single Tax theory, plus Donnie's own life story. Unfortunately many of Stewart's glass plates were destroyed the City. By popular request, Donnie regaled us with the story of the opening of the safe that was left in the museum from its time as a police station and jail. This event became a media sensation and made him a public figure.
