## LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM

September 26, 2018

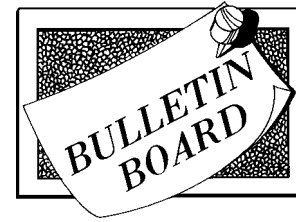
Following an invocation by **Amelia Pope**, the Four-Way Test led by **Brian Britt**, and other preliminaries, **Bob Callahan** spoke to us about Rotary's campaign to wipe out polio. He asked those who had been members in 1988 to stand, recalling the date when the World Health Organization launched the Global Polio Eradication Initiative, joining Rotary in the PolioPlus effort it had started in 1985 (and which has become End Polio Now). Since that date we've reduced polio cases 99.9%, averting 17.4 million cases that would have occurred without our immunization efforts. In 1988, there were 350,000 cases of polio a year in 125 countries. Now the number of polio-endemic countries has been reduced to just three, and there have been only 19 cases so far in 2018 (as of October 2). But if polio is not entirely eradicated, within 10 years, as many as 200,000 children will be paralyzed each year. We need to finish what we started. Bob related that, on a recent trip to Tennessee, he stopped in Tullahoma to visit the George Dickel distillery and bought some whiskey, which he sampled in his hotel room. The next morning he did a hurried job of packing, not realizing that he had failed to put the stopper back in the bottle properly. At lunchtime, when he invited his client to go to lunch, he was mortified when he opened the car and quite concerned about being stopped by state troopers! In the same way, we need to put the cork in the polio bottle and make good on our promise. As long as one child anywhere is at risk, children everywhere are at risk. Rotary's goal is to raise \$50 million per year to support 435,000 vaccinators delivering 2 billion doses of vaccine to 430 million children. Each dose costs \$3; last year our club's donations, matched 2 for 1 by the Gates Foundation, vaccinated 8,400 children, and this generosity ranked our club #25 among the 630 clubs in Zone 30.
