Just 66 days till the eighteenth annual Fairhope Rotary Steak Cookoff on May 11, 2024! It's not too soon to keep talking it up and recruiting new teams and sponsors!

LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM February 28, 2024

After an invocation by Necie Borroni and other preliminaries, Prez Brian reminded us that the steak cookoff is approaching, and we need new teams and sponsors. He then handed off to **Bob Callahan**, who presented a PHF+4 pin to Howard Eddy, in recognition of his giving to the The Rotary Foundation. Bob noted that the Peru project we would hear about was to be funded by a TRF global grant sponsored jointly by the Rotary clubs of San Isidro in Lima, Peru; Gibraltar, Mobile, Lee County Sunrise, and Fairhope. Our guest speaker, Arturo Castro-Guerra, president of the San Isidro club, had worked over a year on this \$80,000 project, and about one more year will be needed to complete it. **Arturo** then took the floor and, with interpretation by Ariel Chavez, assured us that San Isidro is the most important club in Peru! The dam project is a very ambitious one, he said, noting that Peru is divided into three very clear zones: coastal plain, jungle, and mountains. Hundreds of years ago, Incas built these dams at an elevation of over 13,000 feet. They had been abandoned, but archaeologists believed they could be restored, and the project is to restore one of them. But what he was really here for, Arturo said, was to find support for another project: \$107,000 to rebuild a damaged school in Pachacamác, abandoned for ten years. The new school, dubbed Mi Pequeño Paraiso (My Little Paradise), will serve 100 children ages 3–6. Funds are needed mostly for materials since engineering and labor are being provided by volunteers. Arturo showed photos of the current unusable condition of the old school and renderings of the planned new one.

GOOD NEWS

2023 ended with just 12 cases of polio, an almost 45% drop from 2022 totals. Once again, these cases were in Afghanistan and Pakistan.

In better news, countries will soon have easier access to the novel oral polio vaccine type 2, also known as nOPV2, a crucial new tool for stopping outbreaks caused by variant poliovirus. The World Health Organization made this possible by issuing a key approval for nOPV2 in December. This is the first approval of its kind for a vaccine being used under the WHO's Emergency Use Listing.

With nearly 1 billion doses administered already, this next-generation vaccine will continue to play an important role in tackling Type 2 circulating vaccine-derived poliovirus, also known as Type 2 variant poliovirus, and in protecting millions of children against illness and paralysis.
