LAST WEEK'S PROGRAM June 18, 2025

Following an invocation by Gene Brabston, the Pledge

led by Rick Phyfer, and the Five-Way Test led by Gil Wright and other preliminaries, Rick Schrand, filling in for Prez Anil. handed off to Lot Turner of The Native Nursery Landscaping to talk about how landscape design affects ecology. He began by saying that he had been greatly influenced by Bringing Nature Home, by Douglas W. Tallamy, who wrote, "What is the use of a house if you don't have a tolerable planet to put it on?" Native plants are species that naturally occur in a particular region and have adapted over thousands of years to the local climate. All organisms, Lot said, have three goals: to survive (make it to the next day), to grow (create new cells to make future life), and to reproduce (create offspring to pass on their genetic protein). Native plants have the best chance of doing this, but they can be discouraged by invasive species that displace them. Most organisms benefit from others' existence—for example, host plants with pollinators and mycorrhizal fungus with plant roots. A higher volume of plants discourages predators, but invasives, with no natural predators, have an unfair advantage and must be caught early: while it took 80 years for Japanese honeysuckle to expand to ²/₃ of the United States, 120 years for popcorn trees to infest the Southeast US, and 320 years for sycamore maples to spread across the UK, it took no time at all for camphor trees to take over the southern Southeast and Hawaii. To combat diversity loss caused by development and invasive plant displacement, you can plant native varieties such as live oak, hydrangea, beautyberry, liatris, and rudbeckia. You can harvest these from nature, bringing soil from the site and leaving at least 10% of plants in any area.
